For the first time, Dinosaur Drive-Thru will be offered in Arlington, Texas, in the parking lot of Six Flags Hurricane Harbor through January 10, 2021. Dinosaur Drive-Thru is a fantastic option for a family-friendly, COVID-safe activity. The attraction presents over 60, museum-quality and animatronic dinosaurs that will entertain, engage, educate and amaze kids of all ages.

Visitors remain in their vehicles throughout the entire 45-minute show. Each dinosaur is

displayed in chronological order with a very fun and interactive audio tour guide describing all of the interesting facts, and some jokes, about each dinosaur, in both English and Spanish. Zhuang Hong Yi, one of China's most influential artists, utilizes complex patterns of color and texture to create his iconic Flowerbed series. While flying between his hometown of Beijing and Holland, Zhuang was inspired by the kaleidoscopic shift of colors in the flower fields below. Wanting to recreate this experience through his art, Zhuang began using folded rice paper, a traditional Chinese material, to create intricate flower motifs. He then adopted a more western approach by using blocks of bold and vibrant colors which are continuously undulating, depending on the viewer's distance and perspective. *Kaleidoscope* will be on display through February 13, 2021. Learn about Grapevine and the city's heritage by visiting Nash Farm. Purchased by Thomas Jefferson Nash in 1859, this historic landmark brings history to life through exhibits, interpretive programs and touchable displays.

The farm grounds are open for self-guided tours during regular business hours,



admission free. The historic structures and exhibits are open during special events or during a scheduled tour and participation fees may apply. Help Nash Farm preserve, protect and visually reflect the agricultural heritage of the Grapevine Prairie by following their Usage Policy at www.grapevinetexasusa.com/nash-farm.

Events and activities throughout the year include First Fridays at the Farm, Farmhouse on the Grape Vine Prairie, Frugal Farm Wife, Spring into Nash, Fall Round-Up, Dairy Day, Victorian Christmas and many more. Attend one of their events or programs and spend your time touring the buildings, experiencing farm life, learning about farming and doing hands-on activities.

Group tours are available of the 5.2-acre farm, which centers around the Farmhouse Thomas built in 1869, the Historic Barn and a historic cemetery. Groups will be guided through each of these areas and have an opportunity to participate in seasonal hands-on activities presented by Nash Farm staff and volunteers. Pack a picnic and take advantage of their Pole Barn Pavilion following your tour.

Topiaries in the Garden



The Botanical Research Institute of Texas (BRIT®) and Fort Worth Botanic Garden invites visitors to the newest exhibit “Topiaries in the Garden,” running through Jun. 30, 2021.

Featuring 12 plant-based animal shapes, such as elephants, giraffes, and butterflies, the



displays are sure to stimulate a sense of wonderment and fascination.

Topiary is a horticultural practice that trains plants to grow and develop into distinctive shapes. In this case, animal-shaped frames are stuffed with sphagnum peat moss, bound in fishing line, and then planted with flowering annuals, groundcover and other plants.

The process allows for depiction of not

just the shape of the animal, but also the color and texture of its skin, fur or feathers. For the duration of the exhibit Garden staff and volunteers will maintain the topiaries by watering, fertilizing, pinning stray runners, and shearing.

Exhibit viewing is included with the price of Garden admission. Members receive free entry.



Vivian Maier: The Color Work

Vivian Maier (1926- 2009) is an artist veiled by mystery. She spent forty years working as a nanny in Chicago, all the while she shot over 100,000 captivating images. Her works were not discovered by the public until after her death. Dating from the 1950s to the 1980s, *Vivian Maier: The Color Work* captures the street life of Chicago and New York, and includes a number of the artist's enigmatic self-

portraits. Maier's color work was made during the last 30 years of her life when she began to work with a 35-millimetre camera during which time she produced roughly 40,000 Ektachrome color slides. This exhibition is the largest and most highly curated collection of Maier's full-color photographs to date.
