Arlington Independence Day Parade

July 5, 9am in Downtown Arlington

The Arlington Independence Day Parade is the oldest, longest running event in Arlington. Started in 1965 by citizen Dottie Lynn and Church Women United, it was composed of primarily youth on red, white and blue-decorated bicycles, pedaling around Randol Mill Park. It eventually became too large for the park path and has evolved into a two-mile, high-spirited, curb-to-curb ribbon of red, white and blue with 150 entries that rolls through downtown and UTA's College Park District to the beat of patriotic music played by all six Arlington high schools and a variety of other musical entries. Professionally-built floats as well as small entries designed and created by businesses, organizations, churches and youth groups are also now part of the event that attracts some 75,000 spectators each year, many of whom pitch tents on the route the night before to assure they have a good place to view the two-hour patriotic pageant.

The IAM is an exciting new 22,000 square foot museum! Irving's history and culture are presented in a dynamic and immersive new exhibit, *The Irving Story*. Nationally traveling exhibitions and temporary displays change frequently, so there is always something different to see.

The IAM is the first museum in Texas to feature a Smithsonian Spark! Lab where young visitors and their families step into the role of inventor in a hands-on interactive laboratory. The Irving Archives includes documents, photographs, maps, films, oral histories, and artifacts, which are available for exploration and research by appointment. Their gift shop offers unique Irving souvenirs, toys, books, handcrafted items, and Texas-sourced merchandise.

African American Museum

The African American Museum is the only one of its kind in the Southwestern Region devoted to the preservation and display of African American artistic, cultural and historical materials. It has one of the largest African American Folk Art collections in the U.S.

The museum is currently open on Tuesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from noon to 5pm, and is CLOSED on

Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Sundays. Admission is FREE but donations are accepted. Group tours of 10 or more are available and space is available for private events.

Current exhibitions include:

"Tears: Weaponized, Devalued and Reconciled?" compares and contrasts the value placed on the tears of black and white women. *Through July 24.*

"Confederate Currency: The Color of Money" investigates the importance of slavery in the economy of the South. The exhibit by John W. Jones features framed money and acrylic paintings inspired by the images of enslaved people on the currencies. *Through July 24.*

"Facing the Rising Sun" contains photographs, found objects and historical documents that provide insight into a community once called Freedman's Town and now known as Uptown. Interactive video kiosks allow visitors to see and hear from the people who knew Freedman's Town firsthand. *This is an ongoing exhibit.*

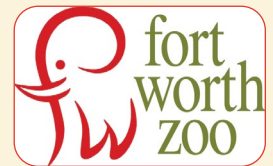

The Science of Guinness World Records

Through September 6 at Perot Museum of Nature and Science

All around the world, people are pushing themselves to achieve new and amazing things. From the world's smallest stop motion film (hint: it's measured in nanometers), to the most drum beats in 60 seconds (2,400 beats or 40 beats per second!), to the most consecutive pinky pull-ups (36!), the world is full of fascinating people achieving strange and incredible feats. Now, for the first time ever, the Perot is looking into the science behind these mesmerizing accomplishments with their new *The Science of Guinness World Records* exhibition.

Discover the marvels of GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS attempts and the science (and secrets) behind their triumphs. Guests will learn what it takes to crash through these seemingly



impossible ceilings, the physical and mental thresholds humans possess, and the scientific principles that explain their awe-inspiring feats. Dozens of engaging exhibits – from the largest Pac-Man videogame, to reaction competitions, speed drumming and a dance-a-thon – will challenge and encourage all ages to go behind the scenes and discover the discipline driving these fascinating accomplishments. *The Science of Guinness World Records* is supported locally by the Dallas Tourism Public Improvement District and, in part, by the City of Dallas Office of Cultural Affairs

Interactive exhibits – including reaction, hang time and balance challenges, speed tag, hoop-it-up basketball, experiments, puzzles, fast fists punching walls, memory tests, a kid's zone and more – will help visitors elicit an understanding of their body, how it responds under distress, and how it focuses and endures. Before exploring, guests can create their own username and digital avatar to track their progress on leaderboards throughout the exhibition.

The AARP Ride@50+ Program is offering free rides to and from COVID-19 vaccinations to anyone needing transportation.

Walmart Community Academy

Walmart Community Academy's purpose is creating economic opportunity and strengthening communities through learning.

Walmart now offers free virtual classes to help the public tackle some everyday life situations such as writing a resume, interview skills, budgeting, banking basics, buying a car or home, computer & mobile device basics, standardized test preparation, navigating college admissions, and natural disaster preparation. Courses are grouped under five themes: career progression, personal finance, home, community, and technology. They will use a network of training academies they developed for employees and they will be taught by Walmart instructors who have led more than 2 million training sessions teaching skills and leadership to its own staff.

Walmart has now developed a "community curriculum" with its own experts and industry leaders. Topics will be expanded throughout the year and future ideas include taxes, entrepreneurship, and civic engagement. Eventually the classes will be held in person at the academies that Walmart has built inside stores and distribution centers. Walmart has more than 200 training academies in the U.S., including 22 in Texas where the program started in 2016.
